

Psalm 40:16

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Let all those that seek thee rejoice and be glad in thee: let such as love thy salvation say continually, The LORD be magnified.

Analysis

The psalm turns from imprecation to blessing, praying that 'all those that seek thee rejoice and be glad.' The contrast between those who seek God's destruction and those who seek God Himself is stark. The phrase 'such as love thy salvation' defines true worshipers: those who delight not merely in deliverance but in the God who saves.

Historical Context

The dual response to God--enemies confounded, seekers rejoicing--appears throughout biblical literature as the pattern of divine judgment. God's actions simultaneously save and judge, depending on one's relationship to Him.

Additional Cross-References

Psalms 35:27 (References Lord): Let them shout for joy, and be glad, that favour my righteous cause: yea, let them say continually, Let the LORD be magnified, which hath pleasure in the prosperity of his servant.

Psalms 68:3 (Parallel theme): But let the righteous be glad; let them rejoice before God: yea, let them exceedingly rejoice.
