Blessed Is the One Who Considers the Poor

- ¹ Blessed is he that considereth the poor: the LORD will deliver him in time of trouble.
- ² The LORD will preserve him, and keep him alive; and he shall be blessed upon the earth: and thou wilt not deliver him unto the will of his enemies.
- ³ The LORD will strengthen him upon the bed of languishing: thou wilt make all his bed in his sickness.
- ⁴ I said, LORD, be merciful unto me: heal my soul; for I have sinned against thee.
- $^{5}\,$ Mine enemies speak evil of me, When shall he die, and his name perish?
- ⁶ And if he come to see me, he speaketh vanity: his heart gathereth iniquity to itself; when he goeth abroad, he telleth it.
- ⁷ All that hate me whisper together against me: against me do they devise my hurt.
- ⁸ An evil disease, say they, cleaveth fast unto him: and now that he lieth he shall rise up no more.
- ⁹ Yea, mine own familiar friend, in whom I trusted, which did eat of my bread, hath lifted up his heel against me.
- $^{\mathbf{10}}$ But thou, O LORD, be merciful unto me, and raise me up, that I may requite them.
- ¹¹ By this I know that thou favourest me, because mine enemy doth not triumph over me.

- ¹² And as for me, thou upholdest me in mine integrity, and settest me before thy face for ever.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

God — אֱלֹהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Lord — יָהוָה / אֵדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (הְּוָהְיִ), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אָדֹנְיִ), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Mercy — רַחֶמִים (Rachamim)

Compassion, mercy

The Hebrew **rachamim** (בַּחָמִים) derives from 'womb' (rechem), suggesting tender, maternal compassion. God's mercies are 'new every morning' (Lamentations 3:23), showing His compassionate nature.
