## **Send Out Your Light and Your Truth**

- <sup>1</sup> Judge me, O God, and plead my cause against an ungodly nation: O deliver me from the deceitful and unjust man.
- <sup>2</sup> For thou art the God of my strength: why dost thou cast me off? why go I mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?
- <sup>3</sup> O send out thy light and thy truth: let them lead me; let them bring me unto thy holy hill, and to thy tabernacles.
- <sup>4</sup> Then will I go unto the altar of God, unto God my exceeding joy: yea, upon the harp will I praise thee, O God my God.
- <sup>5</sup> Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? hope in God: for I shall yet praise him, who is the health of my countenance, and my God.

## **HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES**

**Altar** — מְזְבֶּחַ (Mizbeach)

Altar, place of sacrifice

The Hebrew **mizbeach** (מִוְבַּחַ) means altar—from the root 'to slaughter.' Altars were places where sacrifices were offered to God, pointing forward to Christ's ultimate sacrifice.

God — אֱלֹהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

**Holy** — קדוש (Qadosh)

Holy, set apart

The Hebrew **qadosh** (קְּדוֹשׁ) means holy or set apart—separated from common use for God's purposes. God is 'the Holy One of Israel,' utterly distinct from creation in moral perfection.

Salvation — יִשוּעַה (Yeshuah)

Salvation, deliverance

The Hebrew **yeshuah** (יְשׁוּשָׁהְ) means salvation or deliverance—rescue from danger or enemies. This is the root of 'Jesus' (Yeshua), meaning 'YHWH saves.'

Truth — אֶמֶת (Emet)

Truth, faithfulness

The Hebrew **emet** (אֱמֶת) means truth or faithfulness—reliability and conformity to reality. God is true (emet), utterly faithful to His word and character.
