Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Our heart is not turned back, neither have our steps declined from thy way;

## Analysis

---

The loyalty claim continues: 'Our heart is not turned back, neither have our steps declined from thy way.' Heart (intention, affection) and steps (behavior, practice) together encompass the whole person. The community has not apostatized either internally or externally. Their suffering cannot be explained by unfaithfulness.

## Historical Context

---

The 'way' (derek) of the LORD refers to the path of covenant obedience outlined in Torah. Claiming adherence to this way while suffering challenges simplistic interpretations of blessing and curse.

## Additional Cross-References

---

**Psalms 119:51** (Parallel theme): The proud have had me greatly in derision: yet have I not declined from thy law.

**Psalms 119:157** (Parallel theme): Many are my persecutors and mine enemies; yet do I not decline from thy testimonies.

**Psalms 78:57** (Parallel theme): But turned back, and dealt unfaithfully like their fathers: they were turned aside like a deceitful bow.

**1 Corinthians 15:58** (Parallel theme): Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord.

**Luke 17:32** (Parallel theme): Remember Lot's wife.

**1 Kings 15:5** (Parallel theme): Because David did that which was right in the eyes of the LORD, and turned not aside from any thing that he commanded him all the days of his life, save only in the matter of Uriah the Hittite.
