And the daughter of Tyre shall be there with a gift; even the rich among the people shall intreat thy favour.

Analysis

The 'daughter of Tyre' shall bring gifts, and 'the rich among the people shall intreat thy favour.' Foreign royalty and wealthy citizens seek relationship with the bride because of her connection to the king. Her honor derives from his, anticipating how the church's glory derives from Christ's.

Historical Context

Tyre was a wealthy Phoenician city-state famous for trade. Tyrian royalty bringing tribute indicates the international significance of Israel's king and the honor accorded his bride.

Additional Cross-References

Psalms 22:29 (Parallel theme): All they that be fat upon earth shall eat and worship: all they that go down to the dust shall bow before him: and none can keep alive his own soul.
