Analysis

The summons: 'Hear this, all ye people; give ear, all ye inhabitants of the world.' The scope is universal--not just Israel but 'all inhabitants of the world.' The wisdom offered transcends national boundaries because it addresses universal human concerns: mortality, wealth, and ultimate destiny.

Historical Context

Wisdom psalms addressed universal human experience, not just Israelite covenant concerns. This broad audience indicates the psalm's application to all humanity regardless of nation or status.

Related Passages

Ephesians 2:8 — Salvation by grace through faith

John 3:16 — God's love and salvation

1. Why does this wisdom address 'all inhabitants of the world' rather than just Israel?
2. What universal human concerns does the psalm prepare to address?

Additional Cross-References

Psalms 78:1 (Parallel theme): Give ear, O my people, to my law: incline your ears to the words of my mouth.

Romans 10:18 (Parallel theme): But I say, Have they not heard? Yes verily, their sound went into all the earth, and their words unto the ends of the world.

Matthew 11:15 (Parallel theme): He that hath ears to hear, let him hear.

Revelation 2:29 (Parallel theme): He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches.
