Authorized King James Version (KJV)

They that trust in their wealth, and boast themselves in the multitude of their riches;

Analysis

The false confidence of the wealthy: 'They that trust in their wealth, and boast themselves in the multitude of their riches.' 'Trust' (batach) and 'boast' (halal) reveal the heart's orientation. Wealth becomes their security and identity. The psalmist contrasts this misplaced trust with the reality death brings.

Historical Context

Ancient Near Eastern cultures often equated wealth with divine blessing and assumed riches could provide security against all threats. The psalm exposes this illusion.

Additional Cross-References

Psalms 52:7 (Faith): Lo, this is the man that made not God his strength; but trusted in the abundance of his riches, and strengthened himself in his wickedness.

Jeremiah 9:23 (Parallel theme): Thus saith the LORD, Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom, neither let the mighty man glory in his might, let not the rich man glory in his riches:

1 Timothy 6:17 (Faith): Charge them that are rich in this world, that they be not highminded, nor trust in uncertain riches, but in the living God, who giveth us richly all things to enjoy;
