

# Psalms 51:8

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Make me to hear joy and gladness; that the bones which thou hast broken may rejoice.

## Analysis

---

The plea for joy: 'Make me to hear joy and gladness; that the bones which thou hast broken may rejoice.' Sin has not only brought guilt but destroyed joy. David's 'bones' (deepest being) feel broken by divine judgment. Restored joy will come from hearing God's word of forgiveness.

## Historical Context

---

The imagery of broken bones describes the physical and emotional toll of unconfessed sin (cf. Psalm 32:3-4). Joy requires God's healing word, not just forgetting.

## Additional Cross-References

**Matthew 5:4** (Parallel theme): Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.

**Psalms 35:10** (Parallel theme): All my bones shall say, LORD, who is like unto thee, which deliverest the poor from him that is too strong for him, yea, the poor and the needy from him that spoileth him?

**Luke 4:18** (Parallel theme): The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised,

**Isaiah 35:10** (Parallel theme): And the ransomed of the LORD shall return, and come to Zion with songs and everlasting joy upon their heads: they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

**Psalms 13:5** (Parallel theme): But I have trusted in thy mercy; my heart shall rejoice in thy salvation.
