

# Psalm 55:19

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

God shall hear, and afflict them, even he that abideth of old.  
Selah. Because they have no changes, therefore they fear not  
God.

## Analysis

God's eternity ('from old') grounds His present action against the wicked. The Hebrew 'anah' (afflict/humble) reveals God's active judgment on those who refuse repentance. 'No changes' indicates hardness of heart—the wicked's immutability in rebellion contrasts with God's unchanging righteousness, demonstrating that apostasy results from persistent resistance to grace.

## Historical Context

The reference to God's eternal reign 'from old' connects to Israel's foundational confession of YHWH's sovereignty from creation. Those who 'have no changes' are contrasted with those whom God transforms through covenant renewal.

## Additional Cross-References

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**Deuteronomy 33:27** (References God): The eternal God is thy refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms: and he shall thrust out the enemy from before thee; and shall say, Destroy them.

**Jeremiah 48:11** (Parallel theme): Moab hath been at ease from his youth, and he hath settled on his lees, and hath not been emptied from vessel to vessel, neither hath he gone into captivity: therefore his taste remained in him, and his scent is not changed.
