

Psalms 57:5

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Be thou exalted, O God, above the heavens; let thy glory be above all the earth.

Analysis

The refrain 'Be thou exalted, O God, above the heavens' shifts focus from David's plight to God's glory. This doxological interruption demonstrates proper theology—God's glory as ultimate reality transcending circumstances. 'Let thy glory be above all the earth' is both prayer and prophetic vision of eschatological consummation when every knee bows (Philippians 2:10-11).

Historical Context

This verse functions as the psalm's center, structurally and theologically. Davidic psalms characteristically move from lament to praise, with the turning point marked by doxology focusing on God's transcendent worthiness regardless of circumstances.

Additional Cross-References

Habakkuk 2:14 (Glory): For the earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea.

Isaiah 6:3 (Glory): And one cried unto another, and said, Holy, holy, holy, is the LORD of hosts: the whole earth is full of his glory.

Psalms 72:19 (Glory): And blessed be his glorious name for ever: and let the whole earth be filled with his glory; Amen, and Amen.

Numbers 14:21 (Glory): But as truly as I live, all the earth shall be filled with the glory of the LORD.

Psalms 57:11 (Glory): Be thou exalted, O God, above the heavens: let thy glory be above all the earth.

Isaiah 2:11 (Parallel theme): The lofty looks of man shall be humbled, and the haughtiness of men shall be bowed down, and the LORD alone shall be exalted in that day.

Isaiah 37:20 (References God): Now therefore, O LORD our God, save us from his hand, that all the kingdoms of the earth may know that thou art the LORD, even thou only.
