

# Psalm 62:1

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Truly my soul waiteth upon God: from him cometh my salvation.

## Analysis

The Hebrew 'dumiyyah' (silence/waiting/stillness) before God demonstrates restful trust, not anxious striving. 'My salvation cometh from him' identifies God as source, not circumstances or human allies. This waiting in silence contrasts with the noise of enemies (vv. 3-4), demonstrating that faith's posture is receptive stillness before God's sovereign action.

## Historical Context

Written during another of David's experiences of persecution, this psalm reflects mature faith developed through repeated trials. The silence before God indicates confidence in His timing, not passivity.

1. How does silent waiting before God differ from resigned passivity?
2. What role does stillness play in cultivating faith amid crisis?

**Psalms 62:2** (Salvation): He only is my rock and my salvation; he is my defence; I shall not be greatly moved.

**Psalms 33:20** (Parallel theme): Our soul waiteth for the LORD: he is our help and our shield.

**Lamentations 3:25** (Parallel theme): The LORD is good unto them that wait for him, to the soul that seeketh him.

**Isaiah 12:2** (Salvation): Behold, God is my salvation; I will trust, and not be afraid: for the LORD JEHOVAH is my strength and my song; he also is become my salvation.

**Psalms 40:1** (Parallel theme): I waited patiently for the LORD; and he inclined unto me, and heard my cry.

**Psalms 123:2** (References God): Behold, as the eyes of servants look unto the hand of their masters, and as the eyes of a maiden unto the hand of her mistress; so our eyes wait upon the LORD our God, until that he have mercy upon us.

**Psalms 121:2** (Parallel theme): My help cometh from the LORD, which made heaven and earth.
