Chapter 64 of 150 \cdot 10 Verses \cdot Authorized King James Version

Hide Me from the Wicked

- ¹ Hear my voice, O God, in my prayer: preserve my life from fear of the enemy.
- ² Hide me from the secret counsel of the wicked; from the insurrection of the workers of iniquity:
- ³ Who whet their tongue like a sword, and bend their bows to shoot their arrows, even bitter words:
- ⁴ That they may shoot in secret at the perfect: suddenly do they shoot at him, and fear not.
- ⁵ They encourage themselves in an evil matter: they commune of laying snares privily; they say, Who shall see them?
- ⁶ They search out iniquities; they accomplish a diligent search: both the inward thought of every one of them, and the heart, is deep.
- 7 But God shall shoot at them with an arrow; suddenly shall they be wounded.
- ⁸ So they shall make their own tongue to fall upon themselves: all that see them shall flee away.
- ⁹ And all men shall fear, and shall declare the work of God; for they shall wisely consider of his doing.
- ¹⁰ The righteous shall be glad in the LORD, and shall trust in him; and all the upright in heart shall glory.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

God — אֱלֹהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Lord — יָהוָה / אֵדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (יְהוָה), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנְי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Righteous — צַדִיק (Tzaddik)

Righteous one

The Hebrew **tzaddik** (צַּדִיק) describes one who is righteous, just, or lawful—conforming to God's standard. From the root tzedek (צָּדֶק), meaning righteousness or justice.

Word — דָבַר (Davar)

Word, thing, matter

The Hebrew **davar** (דָבָר) means word, thing, or matter—God's creative and authoritative speech. 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made' (Psalm 33:6).
