Psalms 69

Chapter 69 of $150 \cdot 36$ Verses · Authorized King James Version

Save Me, O God

- ¹ Save me, O God; for the waters are come in unto my soul.
- ² I sink in deep mire, where there is no standing: I am come into deep waters, where the floods overflow me.
- ³ I am weary of my crying: my throat is dried: mine eyes fail while I wait for my God.
- ⁴ They that hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of mine head: they that would destroy me, being mine enemies wrongfully, are mighty: then I restored that which I took not away.
- ⁵ O God, thou knowest my foolishness; and my sins are not hid from thee.
- ⁶ Let not them that wait on thee, O Lord GOD of hosts, be ashamed for my sake: let not those that seek thee be confounded for my sake, O God of Israel.
- ⁷ Because for thy sake I have borne reproach; shame hath covered my face.
- ⁸ I am become a stranger unto my brethren, and an alien unto my mother's children.
- ⁹ For the zeal of thine house hath eaten me up; and the reproaches of them that reproached thee are fallen upon me.
- 10 When I wept, and chastened my soul with fasting, that was to my reproach.
- 11 I made sackcloth also my garment; and I became a proverb to them.
- 12 They that sit in the gate speak against me; and I was the song of the drunkards.

- ¹³ But as for me, my prayer is unto thee, O LORD, in an acceptable time: O God, in the multitude of thy mercy hear me, in the truth of thy salvation.
- ¹⁴ Deliver me out of the mire, and let me not sink: let me be delivered from them that hate me, and out of the deep waters.
- ¹⁵ Let not the waterflood overflow me, neither let the deep swallow me up, and let not the pit shut her mouth upon me.
- Hear me, O LORD; for thy lovingkindness is good: turn unto me according to the multitude of thy tender mercies.
- ¹⁷ And hide not thy face from thy servant; for I am in trouble: hear me speedily.
- ¹⁸ Draw nigh unto my soul, and redeem it: deliver me because of mine enemies.
- ¹⁹ Thou hast known my reproach, and my shame, and my dishonour: mine adversaries are all before thee.
- ²⁰ Reproach hath broken my heart; and I am full of heaviness: and I looked for some to take pity, but there was none; and for comforters, but I found none.
- They gave me also gall for my meat; and in my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink.
- ²² Let their table become a snare before them: and that which should have been for their welfare, let it become a trap.
- ²³ Let their eyes be darkened, that they see not; and make their loins continually to shake.
- Pour out thine indignation upon them, and let thy wrathful anger take hold of them.
- 25 Let their habitation be desolate; and let none dwell in their tents.
- ²⁶ For they persecute him whom thou hast smitten; and they talk to the grief of those whom thou hast wounded.

- 27 Add iniquity unto their iniquity: and let them not come into thy righteousness.
- ²⁸ Let them be blotted out of the book of the living, and not be written with the righteous.
- ²⁹ But I am poor and sorrowful: let thy salvation, O God, set me up on high.
- ³⁰ I will praise the name of God with a song, and will magnify him with thanksgiving.
- This also shall please the LORD better than an ox or bullock that hath horns and hoofs.
- ³² The humble shall see this, and be glad: and your heart shall live that seek God.
- 33 For the LORD heareth the poor, and despiseth not his prisoners.
- ³⁴ Let the heaven and earth praise him, the seas, and every thing that moveth therein.
- ³⁵ For God will save Zion, and will build the cities of Judah: that they may dwell there, and have it in possession.
- ³⁶ The seed also of his servants shall inherit it: and they that love his name shall dwell therein.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

God — אֵלהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Heaven — שָׁמֵים (Shamayim)

Heaven, sky

The Hebrew **shamayim** (שְׁמֵּיִם) means heaven or sky—God's dwelling place and the realm above earth. 'The heaven, even the heavens, are the LORD's' (Psalm 115:16), yet 'the heaven of heavens cannot contain Him' (1 Kings 8:27).

Iniquity — עוֹן (Avon)

Iniquity, guilt, punishment

The Hebrew **avon** ($\mu\nu$) encompasses iniquity, guilt, and its punishment—the twisted nature of sin. 'The LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all' (Isaiah 53:6), Christ bearing our guilt and penalty.

Lord — יְהוָה / אֲדֹנַי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (יְהוָה), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנָי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Love — אַהַבָּה / מֵסֶד (Ahavah / Chesed)

Love / Loyal-love

Hebrew uses **ahavah** (אַהֶּבָּה) for love generally, but the covenant term **chesed** (תְּסָד) describes God's steadfast, loyal love—faithful covenant commitment beyond mere emotion.

Redeem — גַּאַל (Gaal)

To redeem, act as kinsman-redeemer

The Hebrew **gaal** (נַּאַל) means to redeem or act as kinsman-redeemer (go'el)—buying back family property or relatives. It foreshadows Christ redeeming His people through His blood.

Righteous — צַדִּיק (Tzaddik)

Righteous one

The Hebrew **tzaddik** (צַּדִיק) describes one who is righteous, just, or lawful—conforming to God's standard. From the root tzedek (צָּדֶק), meaning righteousness or justice.

Salvation — ישועה (Yeshuah)

Salvation, deliverance

The Hebrew **yeshuah** (יְשׁוּשֶׁהְ) means salvation or deliverance—rescue from danger or enemies. This is the root of 'Jesus' (Yeshua), meaning 'YHWH saves.'

Save — יַשַע (Yasha)

To save, deliver, rescue

The Hebrew **yasha** (יָשַׁע) means to save or deliver —rescue from danger or distress. This is the root of 'Jesus' (Yeshua), meaning 'YHWH saves.' God alone is Savior: 'I, even I, am the LORD; and beside me there is no saviour' (Isaiah 43:11).

Truth — אֵמֶת (Emet)

Truth, faithfulness

The Hebrew **emet** (אֱמֶת) means truth or faithfulness—reliability and conformity to reality. God is true (emet), utterly faithful to His word and character.

Wrath — אַף (Aph)

Wrath, anger

The Hebrew **aph** (אַר) literally means 'nose' or 'nostrils,' idiomatically expressing wrath or anger —God's righteous indignation against sin. Yet God is 'slow to anger' (Exodus 34:6) and 'abundant in mercy.'
