Chapter 7 of 150 \cdot 17 Verses \cdot Authorized King James Version

The Lord Is a Righteous Judge

- ¹ O LORD my God, in thee do I put my trust: save me from all them that persecute me, and deliver me:
- ² Lest he tear my soul like a lion, rending it in pieces, while there is none to deliver.
- ³ O LORD my God, if I have done this; if there be iniquity in my hands;
- ⁴ If I have rewarded evil unto him that was at peace with me; (yea, I have delivered him that without cause is mine enemy:)
- ⁵ Let the enemy persecute my soul, and take it; yea, let him tread down my life upon the earth, and lay mine honour in the dust. Selah.
- ⁶ Arise, O LORD, in thine anger, lift up thyself because of the rage of mine enemies: and awake for me to the judgment that thou hast commanded.
- ⁷ So shall the congregation of the people compass thee about: for their sakes therefore return thou on high.
- ⁸ The LORD shall judge the people: judge me, O LORD, according to my righteousness, and according to mine integrity that is in me.
- ⁹ Oh let the wickedness of the wicked come to an end; but establish the just: for the righteous God trieth the hearts and reins.
- ¹⁰ My defence is of God, which saveth the upright in heart.
- ¹¹ God judgeth the righteous, and God is angry with the wicked every day.

- ¹² If he turn not, he will whet his sword; he hath bent his bow, and made it ready.
- ¹³ He hath also prepared for him the instruments of death; he ordaineth his arrows against the persecutors.
- ¹⁴ Behold, he travaileth with iniquity, and hath conceived mischief, and brought forth falsehood.
- ¹⁵ He made a pit, and digged it, and is fallen into the ditch which he made.
- His mischief shall return upon his own head, and his violent dealing shall come down upon his own pate.
- ¹⁷ I will praise the LORD according to his righteousness: and will sing praise to the name of the LORD most high.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Confess — יֵדַה (Yadah)

To confess, praise, give thanks

The Hebrew **yadah** (חַדַה) means to confess or give thanks—acknowledging truth openly. 'He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy' (Proverbs 28:13).

God — אֱלֹהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Judgment — מִשְפַט (Mishpat)

Judgment, justice

The Hebrew **mishpat** (מִשְׁפֵּט) means judgment or justice—God's righteous decisions and ordinances. God is the Judge of all the earth who 'shall do right' (Genesis 18:25), executing perfect justice.

Lord — יָהוַה / אֵדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (הְּוָהְיִ), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנְיִ), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Repent — שוב / נַחַם (Shuv / Nacham)

To turn back, relent

The Hebrew **shuv** (שוב) means to turn or return—a physical turning that represents spiritual redirection back to God. **Nacham** (בַּחַם) conveys grief or relenting, often used of God 'repenting' of judgment.

Save — יַשַע (Yasha)

To save, deliver, rescue

The Hebrew **yasha** (יָשַׁע) means to save or deliver —rescue from danger or distress. This is the root of 'Jesus' (Yeshua), meaning 'YHWH saves.' God alone is Savior: 'I, even I, am the LORD; and beside me there is no saviour' (Isaiah 43:11).

Righteous — צַדִיק (Tzaddik)

Righteous one

The Hebrew **tzaddik** (צַּדִיק) describes one who is righteous, just, or lawful—conforming to God's standard. From the root tzedek (צָּדָק), meaning righteousness or justice.
