

# Psalms 71:3

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Be thou my strong habitation, whereunto I may continually resort: thou hast given commandment to save me; for thou art my rock and my fortress.

## Analysis

---

The prayer for God to be a 'strong habitation' portrays Him as fortress and dwelling place—both protection and home. 'Whereunto I may continually resort' suggests regular, ongoing refuge, not occasional crisis visits. God has 'given commandment to save me'—divine decree ensures deliverance. 'My rock and my fortress' combines immovability with defensive strength. God is simultaneously secure foundation and protective stronghold, perfectly safe shelter from all threats.

## Historical Context

---

David's wilderness exile provided literal experience of caves and fortresses as refuge. These physical sanctuaries illustrated the greater spiritual reality of God Himself as ultimate safety.

## Additional Cross-References

**Psalms 18:2** (Salvation): The LORD is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, and my high tower.
