

# Psalm 85:13

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Righteousness shall go before him; and shall set us in the way of his steps.

## Analysis

**Righteousness shall go before him** (צדקה לפני יפהלך, tzedek lefanav yehalekh)—Tzedek means righteousness, justice; lefanav means before his face; halakh means walk, go. **And shall set us in the way of his steps** (ישם לנו בעטמו, ve-yasem le-derekh pe'amav)—Yasem means set, place; derekh means way, path; pe'amav means his steps, footsteps.

Psalm 85 prays for restoration after exile. Verses 10-11 picture cosmic reconciliation: "Mercy and truth meet together; righteousness and peace kiss." Verse 13 continues this vision—God's righteousness doesn't just accompany him but goes before him, preparing the way. This anticipates John the Baptist preparing the way for Jesus (Mark 1:2-3). God's righteous character shapes the path his people walk.

## Historical Context

Written after return from Babylonian exile, Psalm 85 reflects both gratitude for restoration and longing for complete renewal. The community had rebuilt the temple but still faced opposition, poverty, and spiritual apathy. They needed God's righteousness to lead them forward.

**Galatians 2:20** (Parallel theme): I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

**1 Peter 4:1** (Parallel theme): Forasmuch then as Christ hath suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves likewise with the same mind: for he that hath suffered in the flesh hath ceased from sin;

**Psalms 119:35** (Parallel theme): Make me to go in the path of thy commandments; for therein do I delight.
