Chapter 92 of 150 · 15 Verses · Authorized King James Version

It Is Good to Give Thanks

- 1** It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High:
- 2** To shew forth thy lovingkindness in the morning, and thy faithfulness every night,
- 3** Upon an instrument of ten strings, and upon the psaltery; upon the harp with a solemn sound.
- 4** For thou, LORD, hast made me glad through thy work: I will triumph in the works of thy hands.

- 5** O LORD, how great are thy works! and thy thoughts are very deep.
- 6** A brutish man knoweth not; neither doth a fool understand this.
- 7** When the wicked spring as the grass, and when all the workers of iniquity do flourish; it is that they shall be destroyed for ever:
- 8** But thou, LORD, art most high for evermore.
- 9** For, lo, thine enemies, O LORD, for, lo, thine enemies shall perish; all the workers of iniquity shall be scattered.

- 10** But my horn shalt thou exalt like the horn of an unicorn: I shall be anointed with fresh oil.
- 11** Mine eye also shall see my desire on mine enemies, and mine ears shall hear my desire of the wicked that rise up against me.

12 The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree: he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon.

13 Those that be planted in the house of the LORD shall flourish in the courts of our God.

14 They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be fat and flourishing;

15 To shew that the LORD is upright: he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Confess — יְדַעַת (Yadah)

To confess, praise, give thanks

The Hebrew **yadah** (יְדַעַת) means to confess or give thanks—acknowledging truth openly. 'He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy' (Proverbs 28:13).

Faith — אֶמְנָה (Emunah)

Faithfulness, trust

The Hebrew **emunah** (אֶמְנָה) encompasses both faith and faithfulness—trusting God and being trustworthy. It implies steadfast reliability, as in 'The just shall live by his faith' (Habakkuk 2:4).

God — אֱלֹהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Lord — יְהֹוָה / אֲדֹנָי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (יְהֹוָה), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנָי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Righteous — צַדִּיק (Tzaddik)

Righteous one

The Hebrew **tzaddik** (צַדִּיק) describes one who is righteous, just, or lawful—conforming to God's standard. From the root **tzedek** (צִדְקָה), meaning righteousness or justice.
