

# Psalms 92:1

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High:

## Analysis

---

This Sabbath psalm opens with the Hebrew 'tov' (good/pleasant), emphasizing that thanksgiving and praise are not merely obligations but spiritually beneficial acts. The connection between thanksgiving to Yahweh and musical praise establishes worship as both vertical (God-directed) and holistic (engaging mind and voice). Reformed theology sees grateful praise as the proper response to God's grace, flowing from recognition of His sovereignty.

## Historical Context

---

Titled as 'A Psalm for the Sabbath day,' this was likely sung in temple worship during Sabbath services. The Sabbath rest provided opportunity for extended meditation on God's works and character.

**Psalms 107:8** (Resurrection): Oh that men would praise the LORD for his goodness, and for his wonderful works to the children of men!

**Psalms 92:8** (References Lord): But thou, LORD, art most high for evermore.

**Psalms 52:9** (Resurrection): I will praise thee for ever, because thou hast done it: and I will wait on thy name; for it is good before thy saints.
