

Psalms 92:15

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

To shew that the LORD is upright: he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him.

Analysis

The psalm concludes with testimony ('show forth') about God's character. Declaring God's uprightness (yashar—straight, right) serves both as praise and proclamation. The emphatic statement 'there is no unrighteousness in him' affirms God's absolute moral perfection. Calling God 'my rock' (tsur) combines personal relationship ('my') with confidence in God's unchanging, reliable nature. This doxological ending demonstrates that mature faith leads to bold declaration of God's character to others.

Historical Context

Israel's testimony about Yahweh's righteousness stood in stark contrast to capricious pagan deities, establishing ethical monotheism as central to biblical faith.

Additional Cross-References

Psalms 18:2 (References Lord): The LORD is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, and my high tower.

Psalms 62:6 (Parallel theme): He only is my rock and my salvation: he is my defence; I shall not be moved.

Job 34:10 (Parallel theme): Therefore hearken unto me, ye men of understanding: far be it from God, that he should do wickedness; and from the Almighty, that he should commit iniquity.

Romans 9:14 (Righteousness): What shall we say then? Is there unrighteousness with God? God forbid.
