

Psalm 99:9

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Exalt the LORD our God, and worship at his holy hill; for the LORD our God is holy.

Analysis

The command to 'exalt the LORD our God' repeats verse 5, creating an inclusio that frames the psalm in worship. Worshiping 'at his holy hill' (har qodsho) refers to Mount Zion where the temple stood, emphasizing both the localized presence and the universal supremacy of God. The final declaration 'for the LORD our God is holy' (kadosh Yahweh Eloheinu) climactically emphasizes God's holiness as the ultimate reason for worship. This threefold emphasis on holiness (vv. 3, 5, 9) echoes the seraphim's 'Holy, holy, holy' and establishes holiness as God's defining attribute.

Historical Context

Mount Zion became holy not by inherent quality but by God's choice to dwell there, teaching that holiness derives from God's presence, not location or human effort.

Additional Cross-References

Luke 1:49 (Holy): For he that is mighty hath done to me great things; and holy is his name.
