Providence

Divine Providence

Divine providence is God's continuous activity in sustaining, governing, and directing all His creatures and all their actions. Scripture teaches that nothing occurs by chance but all things unfold according to God's eternal decree. These studies explore how God upholds and guides all things for His glory and His people's good.

Preservation

God Sustains All Things — God Sustains All Things

The doctrine of preservation asserts that God actively upholds and maintains all created things in existence by His powerful word. This continuous sustaining work distinguishes biblical theism from deism, which posits a God who creates but then withdraws, leaving creation to operate independently according to mechanistic laws.

Hebrews 1:3

Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high;

Colossians 1:17

And he is before all things, and by him all things consist.

Nehemiah 9:6

Thou, even thou, art LORD alone; thou hast made heaven, the heaven of heavens, with all their host, the earth, and all things that are therein, the seas, and all that is therein, and thou preservest them all; and the host of heaven worshippeth thee.

Continuous Creation Rejected — Continuous Creation Rejected

Scripture teaches preservation rather than continuous re-creation, affirming the ongoing existence of the original creation through divine upholding. God established natural orders and patterns that remain constant through His faithful maintenance, not through repeated acts of ex nihilo creation.

Moment by Moment Dependence — Moment by Moment Dependence

All creation depends upon God's sustaining power not merely for initial existence but for continued being at every moment. Should God withdraw His preserving hand even briefly, all things would instantly collapse into nothingness, for creatures possess no inherent power of self-existence.

Providence and Natural Law — Providence and Natural Law

God's ordinary providence operates through the regular patterns and laws He established in creation, which are themselves expressions of His faithful character and wise design. These natural laws describe God's normal mode of operation, not autonomous forces independent of divine will.

Divine Governance

God's Rule Over All — God's Rule Over All

By the breath of God frost is given: and the breadth of the waters is straitened. Also by watering he wearieth the thick cloud: he scattereth his bright cloud: And it is turned round about by his counsels: that they may do whatsoever he commandeth them upon the face of the world in the earth. He causeth it to come, whether for correction, or for his land, or for mercy.

Governance of Individuals — Governance of Individuals

God's providence extends to the particular circumstances of individual lives, directing personal histories according to His wise and loving purposes. Every person's days are numbered, their paths directed, and their circumstances arranged by divine wisdom for both individual good and ultimate glory.

Concurrence

Primary and Secondary Causes — Primary and Secondary Causes

Divine providence operates through the concurrence of God's primary causation with creaturely secondary causes, wherein God works all things according to His will while creatures act according to their natures. God's sovereignty and human agency coexist without contradiction in the mystery of concurrence.

This pattern demonstrates both divine wisdom in creation's design and the dignity of creaturely participation in providential purposes.

Compatibilism — Compatibilism

Scripture affirms compatibilism, wherein divine sovereignty and human responsibility coexist harmoniously. God's eternal decree encompasses all events while humans act voluntarily according to their desires, both truths being simultaneously and fully valid without logical contradiction.

Providence and Evil

Permission of Sin — Permission of Sin

God's providence includes the permission of sin and evil, wherein He allows moral agents to act contrary to His revealed will while ensuring that such actions

ultimately serve His sovereign purposes. This permission demonstrates both divine respect for creaturely freedom and sovereign control over evil's extent and outcome.

God Not Author of Sin — God Not Author of Sin

While God ordains whatsoever comes to pass, He is not the author of sin nor can He be justly charged with evil. His holy nature precludes any moral complicity in wickedness, and the guilt for sinful acts rests entirely upon the creatures who commit them freely according to their own wills.

James 1:13

Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man:

For thou art not a God that hath pleasure in wickedness: neither shall evil dwell with thee.

Limiting and Directing Evil — Limiting and Directing Evil

God's providence exercises sovereign control over evil, setting boundaries to its operation and directing it toward purposes that ultimately manifest His glory and accomplish good. Evil never operates beyond divinely appointed limits, and Satan himself remains on a leash held by the Almighty.

Job 1:12

And the LORD said unto Satan, Behold, all that he hath is in thy power; only upon himself put not forth thine hand. So Satan went forth from the presence of the LORD.

And the LORD said unto Satan, Behold, he is in thine hand; but save his life.

Psalms 76:10

Surely the wrath of man shall praise thee: the remainder of wrath shalt thou restrain.

Greater Good — Greater Good

Providence works all things, including evil and suffering, together for ultimate good to those who love God and for the manifestation of divine glory. What creatures intend for evil, God ordains for good purposes, bringing redemptive fruit from sinful actions and transforming curses into blessings.

Providence and Prayer

Prayer and Sovereignty — Prayer and Sovereignty

Divine sovereignty does not render prayer superfluous but rather establishes it as the ordained means through which God's purposes are accomplished. Prayer changes circumstances not by overriding God's will but by conforming to it, serving as the appointed instrument through which predetermined ends are realized.

Daniel 9:2-3

In the first year of his reign I Daniel understood by books the number of the years, whereof the word of the LORD came to Jeremiah the prophet, that he would accomplish seventy years in the desolations of Jerusalem. And I set my face unto the Lord God, to seek by prayer and supplications, with fasting, and sackcloth, and ashes:

God Ordains Means — God Ordains Means

God ordains not only the ends but also the means to those ends, including prayer as the appointed channel through which His purposes flow to fulfillment. The certainty of divine purposes does not eliminate but rather necessitates prayer, for God has decreed both the outcome and the prayerful means to that outcome.

Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him.

Ye lust, and have not: ye kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain: ye fight and war, yet ye have not, because ye ask not.

Effectual Prayer — Effectual Prayer

Fervent prayer of the righteous accomplishes much, not through human merit but through divine promise to honor the prayers offered in faith according to His will. God delights to answer His children's petitions, using their intercession as the means to display His power and fulfill His predetermined purposes.

James 5:16-18

Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much. Elias was a man subject to like passions as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it might not rain: and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months. And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth brought forth her fruit.

I Kings 18:42-45

Exodus 32:9-14

And the LORD said unto Moses, I have seen this people, and, behold, it is a stiffnecked people: Now therefore let me alone, that my wrath may wax hot against them, and that I may consume them: and I will make of thee a great nation. And Moses besought the LORD his God, and said, LORD, why doth thy wrath wax hot against thy people, which thou hast brought forth out of the land of Egypt with great power, and with a mighty hand? Providence Revealed Through Prayer — Providence Revealed Through Prayer

Through prayer believers discern God's providential leading, learning to align their desires with divine purposes and to recognize answers that demonstrate His active involvement in their circumstances. Prayer serves as both means of providence and means of understanding providence.

Acts 12:5-12

Peter therefore was kept in prison: but prayer was made without ceasing of the church unto God for him. And when Herod would have brought him forth, the same night Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains: and the keepers before the door kept the prison. And, behold, the angel of the Lord came upon him, and a light shined in the prison: and he smote Peter on the side, and raised him up, saying, Arise up quickly. And his chains fell off from his hands. And the angel said unto him, Gird thyself, and bind on thy sandals. And so he did. And he saith unto him, Cast thy garment about thee, and follow me. And he went out, and followed him; and wist not that it was true which was done by the angel; but thought he saw a vision. When they were past the first and the second ward, they came unto the iron gate that leadeth unto the city; which opened to them of his own accord: and they went out, and passed on through one street; and forthwith the angel departed from him. And when Peter was come to himself, he said, Now I know of a surety, that the Lord hath sent his angel, and hath delivered me out of the hand of Herod, and from all the expectation of the people of the Jews. Extraordinary Providence

Miracles Defined — Miracles Defined

Miracles constitute extraordinary works of divine power that transcend, suspend, or reverse natural laws to accomplish God's purposes and authenticate His messengers. These supernatural interventions demonstrate God's absolute sovereignty over creation and serve specific redemptive-historical functions in advancing His kingdom purposes.

Exodus 14:21

And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the LORD caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided.

Joshua 10:12-13

Then spake Joshua to the LORD in the day when the LORD delivered up the Amorites before the children of Israel, and he said in the sight of Israel, Sun, stand thou still upon Gibeon; and thou, Moon, in the valley of Ajalon. And the sun stood still, and the moon stayed, until the people had avenged themselves upon

The foundational sign gifts, including apostolic miracles, served to authenticate revelation and the apostolic office, ceasing with the completion of the biblical canon.

While God remains sovereign to work miracles, the normative pattern of His present operation is through ordinary providence and the Word.

Providence vs Miracle — Providence vs Miracle

Ordinary providence operates through established natural laws while miracles transcend those laws, yet both demonstrate God's sovereign power and serve His purposes. The distinction lies not in divine power exercised but in the mode of operation, whether through regular patterns or supernatural intervention.

Miraculous signs and wonders served specific purposes in redemptive history: authenticating divine messengers, confirming new revelation, manifesting God's glory, and advancing His kingdom purposes. These extraordinary works pointed beyond themselves to spiritual realities and the supremacy of God over all creation.

Exodus 7:9-12

When Pharaoh shall speak unto you, saying, Shew a miracle for you: then thou shalt say unto Aaron, Take thy rod, and cast it before Pharaoh, and it shall become a serpent. And Moses and Aaron went in unto Pharaoh, and they did so as the LORD had commanded: and Aaron cast down his rod before Pharaoh, and before his servants, and it became a serpent. Then Pharaoh also called the wise men and the sorcerers: now the magicians of Egypt, they also did in like manner with their enchantments. For they cast down every man his rod, and they became serpents: but Aaron's rod swallowed up their rods.

God's providence orchestrates all circumstances in the believer's life, both pleasant and painful, to accomplish spiritual good and conformity to Christ's image. This comprehensive working extends to every detail of existence, weaving trials and blessings alike into a tapestry that manifests divine wisdom and love.

Romans 8:28

And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

In whom also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestinated according to the purpose of him who worketh all things after the counsel of his own will:

Particular Providence — Particular Providence

God exercises meticulous care over His children's individual circumstances, numbering their days, directing their steps, and ordering their affairs according to His perfect wisdom. No detail proves too small for divine attention, no concern too trivial for providential arrangement.

Chastening — Chastening

This chastening demonstrates covenant love, distinguishes children from bastards, and produces the peaceable fruit of righteousness in those properly exercised thereby.

Hebrews 12:6-11

For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth. If ye endure chastening, God dealeth with you as with sons; for what

son is he whom the father chasteneth not? But if ye be without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards, and not sons. Furthermore we have had fathers of our flesh which corrected us, and we gave them reverence: shall we not much rather be in subjection unto the Father of spirits, and live? For they verily for a few days chastened us after their own pleasure; but he for our profit, that we might be partakers of his holiness. Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby.

Proverbs 3:11-12

My son, despise not the chastening of the LORD; neither be weary of his correction: For whom the LORD loveth he correcteth; even as a father the son in whom he delighteth.

Revelation 3:19

As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent.

Divine Protection — Divine Protection

Providence encompasses God's watchful care over believers, protecting them from dangers seen and unseen, preserving them through trials, and keeping them unto final salvation. This protection operates through both natural and supernatural means, employing angels, circumstances, and direct intervention as wisdom dictates.

Psalms 91:11-12

For he shall give his angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways. They shall bear thee up in their hands, lest thou dash thy foot against a stone.

Psalms 34:7

The angel of the LORD encampeth round about them that fear him, and delivereth them.

Daniel 6:22

My God hath sent his angel, and hath shut the lions' mouths, that they have not hurt me: forasmuch as before him innocency was found in me; and also before thee, O king, have I done no hurt.
