## Obedience

Submitting to God's commands out of love and reverence

Obedience represents the practical demonstration of faith, the visible evidence of invisible grace. Biblical obedience is not mere external compliance but wholehearted submission flowing from love. "If ye love me, keep my commandments" (John 14:15). This obedience does not earn salvation but expresses it—the grateful response of those who have received immeasurable grace.

Scripture presents obedience as **better than sacrifice** (1 Samuel 15:22), revealing that God desires hearts, not merely rituals. True obedience involves both attitude and action, inner motivation and outward conformity. It extends to all areas of life—thought, word, and deed—and grows from recognition of God's wisdom, goodness, and authority. "Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths" (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Christ provides the perfect model of obedience. He "became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross" (Philippians 2:8), demonstrating absolute submission to the Father's will. His obedience secured our justification—"by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous" (Romans 5:19). Now believers are called to follow His example, walking in obedience not to earn His favor but because they already possess it.

The blessings of obedience are numerous: peace, protection, provision, and intimacy with God. "If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land" (Isaiah 1:19). Yet even apart from blessings, obedience remains right because God is worthy of our submission. His commands are not burdensome but beneficial, expressions of love from One who knows what is best for His creatures.

## Called to Obey

The command to obedience

**John 14:15** — If ye love me, keep my commandments

If ye love me, keep my commandments.

**Deuteronomy 11:13** — Diligently hearken to my commandments

And it shall come to pass, if ye shall hearken diligently unto my commandments which I command you this day, to love the LORD your God, and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul,

**1 Samuel 15:22** — To obey is better than sacrifice

And Samuel said, Hath the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams.

**Acts 5:29** — We ought to obey God rather than men

Then Peter and the other apostles answered and said, We ought to obey God rather than men.

## Christ's Obedience

Jesus as our example

**Philippians 2:8** — Obedient unto death

And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

**Romans 5:19** — By the obedience of one

For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous.

**Hebrews 5:8** — Learned obedience by suffering

Though he were a Son, yet learned he obedience by the things which he suffered;

**John 6:38** — Not my will, but thy will

For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me.

## Blessings of Obedience

The rewards of following God

**Deuteronomy 28:1-2** — Blessings shall come upon thee

And it shall come to pass, if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice of the LORD thy God, to observe and to do all his commandments which I command thee this day, that the LORD thy God will set thee on high above all nations of the earth:

**Isaiah 1:19** — If willing and obedient

If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land:

**John 14:23** — Father will love him

Jesus answered and said unto him, If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him.

**James 1:25** — Blessed in his deed

But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed.

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
